## **Installation Procedure**

- 1. Install brake pads properly. Be sure pads are securely positioned in the caliper.
- 2. Flush system with fresh brake fluid.
- 3. Check all hydraulic parts for excess wear and tear.
- 4. Check disc for proper thickness, parallelism, and lateral runout.
- 5. Check disc for scoring or grooves over .012"depth. If either applies, resurfacing is required.
- 6. If discs do not need resurfacing, then contamination from the previous brake pads must be removed. Sand discs with 130-grit sandpaper using moderate pressure. Use soap and water to clean disc surface after sanding and machining. Discs should be free and clear of oil, grease, and brake fluid.
- 7. Inspect calipers for freedom of movement. Lubricate where necessary.

## **Bed-in / Burnishing Instructions**

- 1. After installing new brake pads, make 6-to-10 stops from approximately 30-35 MPH applying moderate pressure.
- 2. Make an additional 2-to-3 hard stops from approximately 40-45 MPH.
- 3. DO NOT DRAG BRAKES!
- 4. Allow at least 15 minutes for the brake system to cool down.
- 5. After step 4 is completed, your new Hawk Performance brake pads are ready for use.
